BACKGROUND:

The complainant has stated that he does not know the full names of two civilian witnesses, nor addresses or telephone numbers for all three listed. Two canvass letters were circulated in the surrounding neighborhood to ascertain additional witness information in general, and with respect to the three listed civilian witnesses. No response was received.

NOTICE TO COMPLAINANTS AND SUBJECT OFFICERS:

You may bring to the hearing additional witnesses, documents, or other evidence, which are not covered in this report and request that it be considered by the Board. The Board's legal advisor shall rule on the admissibility of such evidence. Please submit this evidence to the investigator in advance of the hearing. Note: Requests for a continuance shall be made within 72 hours of receipt of this report.

CPRB Complaint No. 00-13 Andre Dante Piazza, Complainant

I. DATE, TIME AND LOCATION OF ALLEGED INCIDENT:

This incident occurred on Tuesday, May 2, 2000 at approximately 6:30 p.m. in the 2000 block of 23rd Avenue, Oakland, California.

II. JURISDICTION:

Original Jurisdiction

This complaint was timely filed under the Board's original jurisdiction of excessive force on May 3, 2000.

Mr. Piazza alleges that OPD Officer Gonzales, in violation of *OPD Manual of Rules No. 370.27*, Use of Physical Force, and OPD General Order K-3, Use of Force:

- 1. Squeezed complainant's throat.
- 2. Slapped complainant's face causing injury to his jaw.
- 3. Pulled up quickly on complainant's handcuffed hands causing a burst of pain.

Supplemental Jurisdiction

Mr. Piazza filed with OPD/IAD on May 31, 2000, and the complaint is pending final disposition. CPRB has jurisdiction over the following supplemental issues: Mr. Piazza alleges that OPD Officer Gonzales,

- 1. Conducted a strip search and visual body cavity search on the complainant in the field, in violation of *OPD Training Bulletin I-O.2*, *Searches*.
- 2. Threatened witness George Moore with his baton after Moore protested Officer Gonzales' treatment of the complainant, in violation of *OPD Manual of Rules No. 314.07*, *Use of Threatening Conduct.*
- 3. Told the complainant to "shut up" after he had inquired as to why he was to be searched, in violation of *OPD Manual of Rules No. 314.07*, *Use of Demeaning Language*.

III. SUMMARY OF COMPLAINT:

According to Mr. Piazza, he was walking with his cousin, George Moore, and their friend named "Gilky" in the 2000 block of 23rd Avenue on May 2, 2000 at approximately 6:30 p.m., when two OPD officers drove up. The officers (later identified as Officer Patrick Gonzales and Officer Christopher Sansome) got out

of their vehicle and told Mr. Piazza and his companions to stop and empty the contents of their pockets onto the ground. The officers handcuffed Mr. Piazza and Mr. Moore and told Gilky to leave the immediate area. Gilky retreated to the porch area of an adjacent house where he continued to watch the incident.

Mr. Piazza inquired as to why he and Mr. Moore were detained, and was told to "shut up" by Officer Gonzales. Mr. Piazza and Mr. Moore were then placed in the back of the patrol vehicle, and their names were checked for warrants on the police computer.

Mr. Piazza repeatedly asked why they had been stopped, and the officers responded, "zero tolerance" and "we are just doing our job." Both Mr. Piazza and Mr. Moore's names came back "Charlie", or clear for warrants. Mr. Moore was let out of the police vehicle and his handcuffs were taken off. Mr. Moore then stood nearby and observed the police officers interact with Mr. Piazza. The officers then informed Mr. Piazza that he would be searched. Mr. Piazza protested that a search was unnecessary because his name had come up clear on the police computer. Officer Gonzales then told Mr. Piazza to "shut up."

Officer Gonzales placed Mr. Piazza next to the open door of the police vehicle and proceeded to pull his pants down to his knees. Officer Gonzales then pulled Mr. Piazza's underwear halfway down his buttocks. Mr. Piazza protested to Officer Gonzales that he could not do this to him. Officer Gonzales grabbed Mr. Piazza's still handcuffed hands and pulled up quickly on both of them, giving Mr. Piazza a burst of pain. Next, Officer Gonzales placed his hands on Mr. Piazza's buttocks and simultaneously pulled his buttocks cheeks apart and looked into his opened orifice for drugs. Officer Gonzales then lifted and felt under Mr. Piazza's testicles. Mr. Piazza related that this search occurred during daylight hours, and 23rd Avenue was busy with vehicular traffic. Mr. Piazza said the #62 bus had passed by, and the passengers could see Mr. Piazza with his pants down being searched.

Officer Gonzales next lifted and pulled Mr. Piazza's head back, and then both squeezed his throat with one hand, and pressed on the sides of his jaw with the other. Mr. Piazza's mouth was forced open and Officer Gonzales looked inside for drugs. Mr. Piazza was then released from his handcuffs and began to leave the area.

Mr. Piazza stopped and told Officer Gonzales that he had violated his rights, and Officer Gonzales responded by taking his open right hand and forcefully slapping Mr. Piazza across the cheek. The force of the strike made Mr. Piazza's head turn. Mr. Piazza asked Officer Gonzales why he had hit him, and Officer Gonzales responded, "because I can." Mr. Moore protested this treatment, and Officer Gonzales pulled his baton and threatened him with it.

Mr. Piazza's jaw hurt and he could not bite down, close his mouth, or talk well afterwards. Mr. Piazza then called 911 for his injuries and a Sergeant (later identified as Sgt. Van Sloten) arrived to assess Mr. Piazza's condition and note Mr. Piazza's allegation of being slapped by Officer Gonzales. Mr. Piazza was then transported to Highland Hospital by ambulance where his jaw was manipulated back into alignment.

If you are required to file your complaint with OPD/PSD before CPRB can initiate an investigation over all or part of your complaint, important time deadlines must be met before CPRB can accept your complaint or certain issues in your complaint for investigation:

- If the Oakland Police Department is unable to complete its investigation within ninety (90) days from the date of filing, you may file your complaint with the CPRB. YOU MUST FILE WITH THE CPRB WITHIN THIRTY (30) DAYS FROM THE END OF THE NINETY (90) DAY PERIOD.

CITIZEN'S POLICE REVIEW BOARD INTERVIEW SUMMARY

Complainant Andre Dante Piazza

Complainant Andre Dante Piazza was interviewed on May 3, 2000, by CI Diana Christensen at the offices of the Oakland Citizen Police Review Board.

Eighteen- year- old complainant Andre Dante Piazza said he met up with his cousin George Moore (29) and their close friend "Gilky" outside of Tony's Liquors. The three walked and talked until they were in front of Gilky's halfway house on 23rd between East 20th and East 21st Streets. Gilky recently got out of prison. The three of them were talking about Gilky's new job parking cars and discussing whether Moore and Piazza could also get similar work.

Two police officers pulled their car up and looked at three individuals. Complainant Piazza thought the police car number was either 1815 or 1518. The officers got out and told them to put their belongings onto the ground. Gilky protested that he lived right there and one of the officers told him to leave. Gilky retreated to his front porch where he continued to watch the officers and his friends. The officers handcuffed Piazza and Moore. When Piazza asked why they were being detained, one of the officers said that they got a call. When Piazza told the officer that they had just gotten there, the officer told him to "Shut up."

Piazza and Moore were placed into the back of the patrol car. Their names were run through the police computer. Piazza repeatedly asked why they had been stopped and the officers responded, "zero tolerance" and "we're just doing our job." Both Moore and Piazza came up "Charlie" (clear of warrants) on the police computer. Moore was let out and his cuffs were taken off. Moore stood nearby watching the police in their dealings with his cousin.

The officer who primarily dealt with complainant Piazza was Caucasian with blond short hair and a mustache. This officer had a big muscular build and was about 5'10" to 5'11" in height. Complainant Piazza said that he believed the first two numbers in the officer's badge were 7 and 5, but the last number, which may have been a 6, was covered by a black band. Complainant Piazza said that he thought the officer's name was P. Gonzales.

The second officer was short, about 5'7" or 5'6." Piazza said this officer was a "pretty boy," a skinny Caucasian with an Elvis hairdo. This officer was the driver of the vehicle. The second officer had little to say or do with complainant Piazza, so Piazza did not get his badge number.

Complainant Piazza was then told that he would be searched. When Piazza protested that he had come up clear on the computer, Officer Gonzales told him to "Shut up." Officer

Gonzales placed complainant Piazza next to the open door of the vehicle and pulled Piazza's pants down to his knees. The officer then pulled the back of Piazza's boxer shorts halfway down his buttocks. Complainant Piazza told him, "You can't do this." Officer Gonzales then took Piazza's handcuffed hands and lifted them up quickly, giving Piazza a burst of pain. Officer Gonzales proceeded to place his hands onto Piazzas buttocks and simultaneously pull the cheeks apart. Piazza said that Gonzales looked into his opened buttocks to see if he had drugs. Complainant Piazza said that Officer Gonzales next turned to the front of Piazza's body and "lifted and was lookin' under my sacks and stuff." Piazza confirmed that what he meant was that the officer lifted and felt around and under his testicles. Piazza said he told the officer "make me feel like you're fruity."

Complainant Piazza said that the search occurred in complete daylight at about 6:30 p.m. It occurred on a busy street and at least one bus, the 62 came down the street. People who passed by could see him there with his pants down.

Officer Gonzales next lifted and pulled complainant Piazza's head back. The officer then both squeezed Piazza's Adam's apple with one hand and pressed on the sides of his jaw with the other. Piazza's mouth was forced open and the officer looked inside for drugs. Complainant Piazza was then released from his handcuffs and he started to leave.

Complainant Piazza told Officer Gonzales, "You're violating my rights." Officer Gonzales responded by taking his right open hand and forcefully slapping complainant's Piazza's cheek. The force of the strike made Piazza's head turn. Piazza's jaw hurt and he could not bite down, close his mouth or talk well. When Piazza asked the officer why hit him, the officer responded, "Cause I can." Piazza's cousin began to protest and Officer Gonzales pulled his baton and threatened him with it

Gilky, George Moore, and a man named Skeet from the half way house had witnessed the incident and encouraged Piazza to go to Highland Hospital for medical attention. Complainant Piazza went into the Shoppers' Market at East 21st and the store clerk gave him a baggie of ice for his jaw. Piazza called 911 from there and both a fire truck and an ambulance responded. A police sergeant came and took a report. Another officer came and took four or five pictures of his face. Complainant Piazza said he proceeded to Highland Hospital where his jaw was manipulated back into alignment. He was also given pain medication.
