Good afternoon. We are members of the local community who are organized under the Anti Police-Terror Project. You may know us from our recent work where we coordinated and helped to facilitate 96 hours of direct action to reclaim the radical legacy of Martin Luther King, Jr. that concluded with a peaceful march with some 7,000 people in attendance.

The Anti Police-Terror Project is a Black Led coalition which locally organizes with individuals and organizations from a diverse range of backgrounds from clergy and students to business professionals who are all concerned with police brutality, specifically the killing of black people and people of color which is happening at the rate of one every 28 hours in this Country.

In regards to the recent police killing of Yvette Henderson, which occurred in Oakland, CA this past Tuesday, we have a few basic questions for you that we hope you might be able to answer.

1. Does or did Home Depot have footage of a suspect in an altercation with one of your employees on that day?
2. What areas specifically do the surveillance cameras on the Home Depot premises (inside and outside) cover?
3. Did any Home Depot staff or contractor positively identify the suspect to a member of the Emeryville Police Department directly immediately or shortly after the altercation inside of the store?
4. Did Home Depot hand over any footage to any law enforcement agency. If so, to whom and when?
